Hello UWS! Or, should I say good-bye? It has been my pleasure to have been a student here since May 2015.

The first thing others may notice about me is I am not a young twenty-something—really, I am not! However, it did not stop me from being elected as the student body president for 2018-19. So, I would like to thank the student body for this past year.

In my time as president, we passed the Indigenous Proclamation, supporting the First Nations Center and Indigenous people, past, present and future. We also passed the Student Resolution in Support of Refugee Resettlement. Not only was that legislation passed at UWS, but I brought it down to the UW-System meeting representing all the state

universities in Wisconsin and had it passed. We are the first university in the nation to achieve that on both levels!

As far as the future, and specifically next year, goes there is more to be done. The faculty senate wants to remove students from the Credit and Reinstatement Committee. I was able to lobby enough of the faculty in December to stop it, but they have informed me they want to retry the legislation now that a couple of the faculty are not here.

It is, in my opinion, a real backhanded, shifty move by the adults in the room that couldn't get their way the first time.

Students also need to question the security camera issue in the residence halls and parking lots.

The administration is working on it, but they are looking at a two-year process. Is that something that sits well with you regarding your safety?

Students have power if they use their voice, so please use it!

I am not sure if everyone on this campus realizes the fact that almost no other UW campus charges a full fee for online classes, but ours does. Sometimes our only option for a required class is online. This is not covered in our 12-18 credit fee plateau. And for those who don't know, online fees are upwards of an additional \$1,300!

Other universities use this fee to fund certain programs. But what does our fee fund?

Instructors are not getting more funding. The key is

to speak up!

Any student that is affected by this needs to go to the Dean, the Provost, the chancellor, and your advisors—the more noise, the better.

Any and all students in a student organization should beware as well.

The section of the student government called S is proposing penalties that are tyrannous at best. There are some organizations that go over their budgets, and the question being asked is, "is this done with malice or oversight?"

The solution proposed by SUFAC involves a 50% cut to the student organization the following year.

SGA proposed training advisors better and there is also a new program coming in to help but the

details are not known. SUFAC wanted to pass it anyway.

Three of your senators voted against it and stopped it. If I were able, I would have vetoed it, and the administration is not necessarily on board either.

The issue will come up again and the key in all these instances is that YOU have a voice. If it is used as a force it can make change. There are no less than 20 committees that students can join in conjunction with faculty and staff.
