11 Years (2006)

Oct. 18th – The UWS Black and Gold Committee awarded the Promethean staff the Black and Gold Award for outstanding school spirit. The committee defined the paper as “Dedicated students who volunteer their time and efforts to keep every member of the UWS campus informed and connected”

A group of students led by Professors Dr. Mary Pulford and Dr. Marshal Johnson will be leaving for China on May 21st to begin an exciting sojourn to the East. The trip ended with a stop in Beijing where students studied socio-economics and urban development.

35 Years (1982)

Julie Peterson set a new school record last Saturday as she paced the Yellowjackets women’s cross country team with a 7th place finish at the Bemidji State Invitational. She completed the 3.1 mile course in 20 minutes flat, shattering the old record of 20:47 set by teammate Brenda Maynard.

75 Years (1942)

Oct. 16th – Festivities are underway today to begin the two day celebration of STC’s annual homecoming. A rapid procession of activities for students and alumni begin this morning at 10:20 with the coronation of King Leslie Bundgaard and Queen Marjorie Vattendahl.

The parade begins at 2:15 this afternoon which will begin with the band leading the way up Belknap, then down Tower to Broadway, and back again.

The Yellowjacket football squad will clash with Eau Claire tonight in the homecoming feature at Gates Field in Superior. They have not lost a homecoming game since 1930 and have won their first two games this season under the command of Coach Ted Wheratt. After the game a dance featuring the grand march will be held in the large gymnasium.

25 Years (1992)

Oct. 23rd – Approximately 100 people attended the debate between U.S. Rep. David Obey (D-Wis) and Republican candidate Dale Vannes last Tuesday on campus. The event was hosted and broadcast live by WI Public Radio and KUWS while being held in the Katherine Ohman Theater.
