

The Aurora Borealis, also known as the Northern Lights, shown through the North of the United States on March 23 through 25. Although not extremely rare as they can be seen in some form, this particular weekend was special due to how strong the lights were shining. They were bright enough to be seen from Virginia to Arizona. The Northern Lights appear when solar energy from the sun clashes with the magnetic field from the Earth. The measurement for this sensation is called the KP-index, or "Planetary Index". It measures the geomagnetic activity in the Earth's atmosphere. This particular storm went up to KP-8 on the scale on March 24, which was deemed the best day to go and see the lights.
